Farm Safety Day

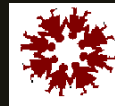

School Council News

Last night our School Council met. School Council have approved Tuesday October 23rd as a Pupil Free Day; on this day staff from Stanhope, Girgarre and Lancaster will be revisiting the School Wide Positive Behaviour initiative which relates to school values, student behaviour and discipline. School Council also endorsed two revised policies- Teaching and Learning Statement and Curriculum Policy. Both of these policies will be uploaded to our school website very soon for all families to read.

School Council also learned about the donation of the Trooper Jones Bear by Leocata's Transport. This bear has been generously donated to the school to be used as a teaching tool when students are learning about Australian Soldiers (very useful for work that is done in the lead up to Remembrance Day and Anzac Day). The bear is a replica of a World War One soldier- with correct uniform and regalia.



NAPLAN Online

Our school has been selected as one of the many schools to transition from the pen and paper test to online assessment in 2019. (By 2020, all schools across Australia will conduct the NAPLAN tests online). The tests (with the exception of Yr 3 Writing- which is still handwritten) will be delivered via the newly developed Online National Assessment Platform. Some reasons behind the tests being delivered online include: more engaging tests, tailored testing (adaptive), longer testing period and faster results.

In preparation for this transition, staff -(Megan, Narelle and Lisa) have each attended a 3 hour training session in Bendigo and will need to conduct a School Readiness Test (SRT). The intention is not to retest the students, but rather, help our school to determine the most effective methods for test delivery, test our school's ICT capability and also for the department to test the platform. Our SRT will be conducted with the current Yr 3 and 5 students between August 22nd and September 5th. The Year 3 and 5 2018 NAPLAN results were due to be released by now, however, I received notification last week that there is a hold up with the release of results. Families of the students concerned, will be notified as soon as we have the results.

Waste Pioneers Excursion

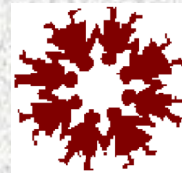
