Our **School Wide Positive Behaviour Focus** for the coming fortnight will be around the **Learning Environment**. 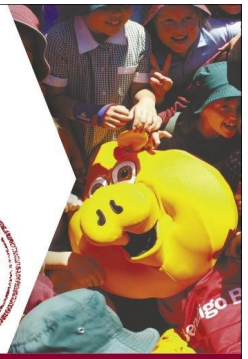
