Principal Learning

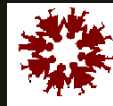
Over Tuesday and Wednesday I was at the annual Leadership conference. It was a great opportunity for me to take advantage of the knowledge and expertise of a number of experts in the field of education and research. The importance of having a clear vision and sense of direction was one key aspect of several presenters. Our school vision is based on our *four school values* and this is integrated throughout all aspects of our school.

Last week I took the opportunity to sign up for the VICSWPBS, which is the new Department's version of what we're already doing here. I planned last year to revisit our SWPBS practice and then the opportunity to be supported with coaching in our school arose. Subsequently we are now the second school in Loddon/Campaspe to sign up for this support. Lisa Duffy, who will be taking the reins during my absence throughout term 3, will be leading the school according to our school values and according to the protocols and policies we follow, including this particular system enhancement of work we already do.

Our school values also provide the basis for the teaching and learning in our school and I will be leading the teachers in how this can be strengthened through collaboration and consistency of approach, providing rigorous and effective learning and teaching.

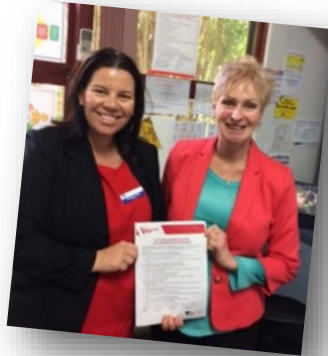

Open Day

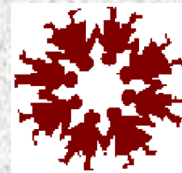

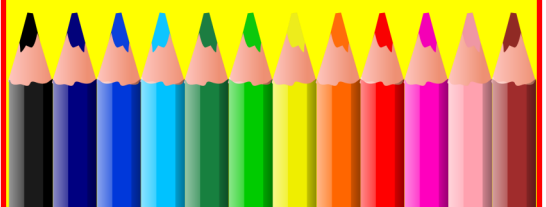

DALLAS: Red went to the moon—he wasn't scared!



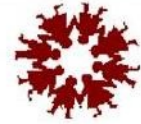
