Stanhope Place Based Plan

Last week, I represented the school at the community meeting of the Place Based Plan. The evening was well run and all major groups in the township, were present and able to put forward responses and ideas as the program proceeded. There will be some further follow up meetings involving the establishment of a committee to drive the development of ideas into a practical plan.

School Council

Last night, School Council heard from Mr Paul Hon, about the process and actions involved in our School Review. The process has been made significantly more robust and will involve input from all levels of the school community. This is an opportunity for us all to reflect on what we have achieved over the last four years and identify what has worked and what we should change.

Naplan Success

Our online Naplan testing has been completed successfully with only a couple of momentary signal drop outs, but all students were able to complete their tests online. Teachers had comprehensively prepared the students with the skills and knowledge they needed to transfer when taking the tests. Mrs Sheedy and Alannah ran Round Robin activities with the grade 4 & 6 students who mentored the P-2 students in various sporting skills.

Cross Country

Tomorrow grade 4, 5 & 6 students will attend the Echuca Cross Country event. Thank you to those parents who have volunteered to drive students. Students will leave school at 11.30am with Cross Country events beginning at 12.30pm at Victoria Park. Please speak to Mrs D for further details.

Forms are unable to be printed out on the day of the excursion, so parents and guardians will have to hand-write missing permissions on the day of the excursion.

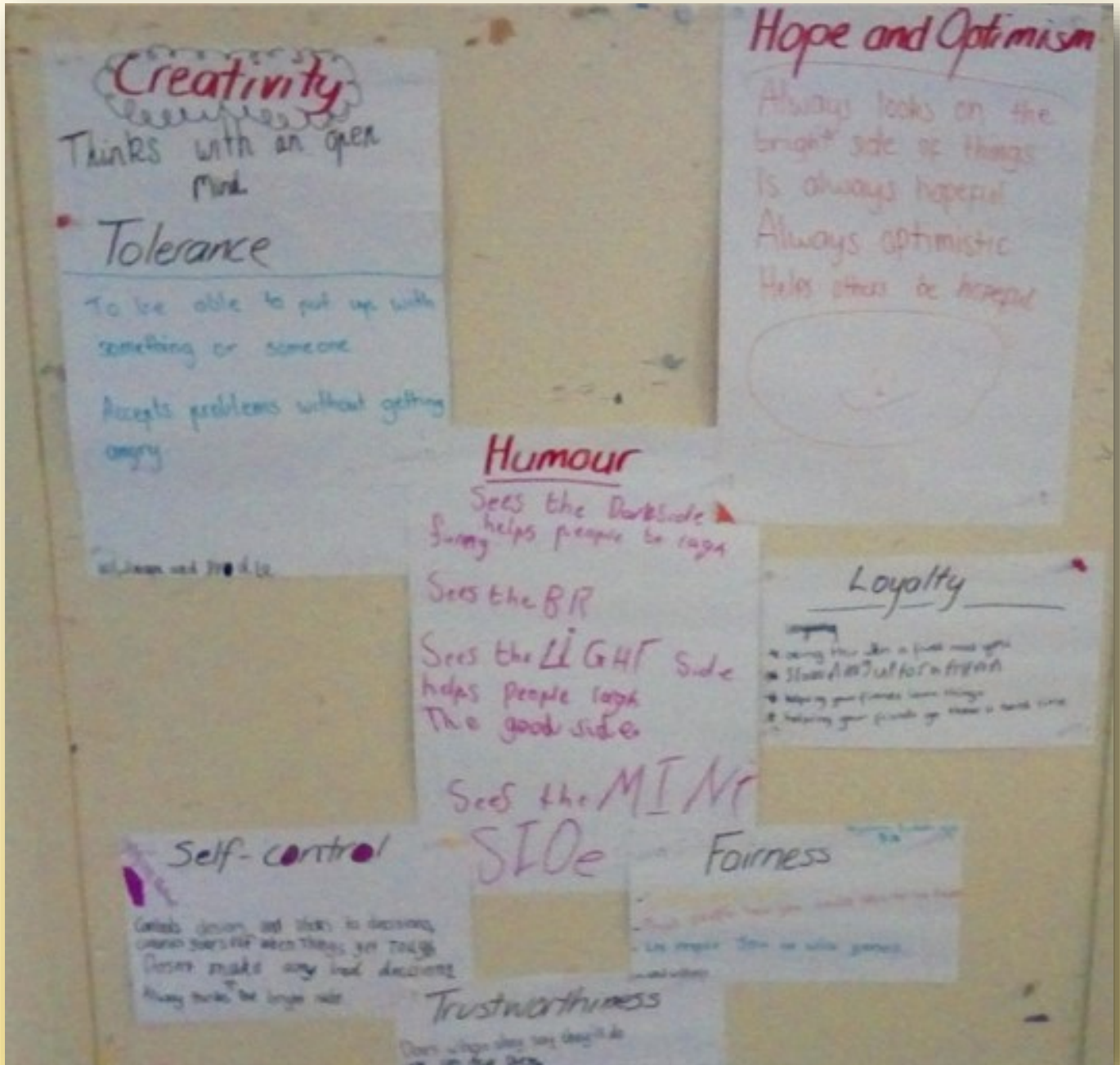

The use of behavioural consequences is a way of teaching children to take greater responsibility for their lives and to learn to make smarter choices.

Reading Tips for Parents

By Reading Rockets

The early years are critical to developing a lifelong love of reading. You can't start reading to a child too soon!

Read together every day.

Read to your child every day. Make this a warm and loving time when the two of you can cuddle close together. Bedtime is an especially great time for reading together.

Give everything a name.

You can build comprehension skills early, even with the littlest child. Play games that involve naming or pointing to objects. Say things like, "Where's your nose?" and then, "Where's Mommy's nose?" Or touch your child's nose and say, "What's this?"

Say how much you enjoy reading together.

Tell your child how much you enjoy reading with him or her. Look forward to this time you spend together. Talk about "story time" as the favorite part of your day.

Read with fun in your voice.

Read to your child with humour and expression. Use different voices for different characters. Ham it up!

Know when to stop.

If your child loses interest or has trouble paying attention, just put the book away for a while. Don't continue reading if your child is not enjoying it.

Be interactive.

Engage your child so he or she will actively listen to a story. Discuss what's happening, point out things on the page, and answer your child's questions. Ask questions of your own and listen to your child's responses.

Read it again and again and again.

Your child will probably want to hear a favourite story over and over. Go ahead and read the same book for the 100th time! Research suggests that repeated readings help children develop language skills.

Talk about writing, too.

Draw your child's attention to the way writing works. When looking at a book together, point out how we read from left to right and how words are separated by spaces.

Point out print everywhere.

Talk about the written words you see in the world around you and respond with interest to your child's questions about words. Ask him or her to find a new word every time you go on an outing.

Get your child evaluated if you suspect a problem.

Please be sure to see your child's paediatrician or teacher as soon as possible if you have concerns about his or her language development, hearing, or sight.

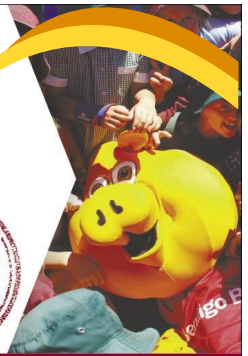
