From the Principal

School Wide Positive Behaviour Supports

Since last year, our school has had an increased focus on implementing SWPBS with fidelity. We do this through ensuring a consistency of approach across the school and through retaining our core belief in the impact of explicitly teaching expected behaviours, rather than simply punishing students for doing the 'wrong' thing. Our Class Dojo reflects the behaviours that we encourage and also those behaviours we want to minimise. A key feature is that the behaviour is separated from the student. A SWPBS approach is restorative and inclusive in nature, not punitive. Recently, we developed three key school wide expectations, which underpin our values and our classroom and playground behaviours. These are:

to be respectful

to be open to learning

to be a good citizen

You will see these on posters around the school and can be used to remind students of their obligations. Of course, these expectations equally apply to staff and the school community.

Naplan

Naplan testing is all but over for this year. Our school had opted last year, to participate in the online version, as we knew there would be issues changing format, and having training for staff last year and again this year, would minimise any likely issues. We did not experience any of the much publicised problems, here at Stanhope and students found the tests quite manageable.

Communication At End Of School Day

Where possible, please notify the school as early as possible to any change in collection times or pick ups. We have found that there have been phone calls or texts advising of a change of plans for collection or pick up, but as there was no one in the office to take the call, the message was not accessed until after the bell. The end of day is extremely busy, so last minute calls or messages may get missed. Mica is generally in the office on Tuesdays and Thursdays, but on other days, there is no guarantee of anyone being there to take last minute calls. We understand that sometimes things do happen at the last minute and realise that's when a call needs to be made.

School Review

Staff are currently starting work on some of the many aspects of our Review process. One area where all families can contribute to the Review, is by reminding us of some of the highlights over the past four years. A note in the office mailing box, is all it takes! It might be related to classroom or playground or excursions or something else entirely! That's up to you!
