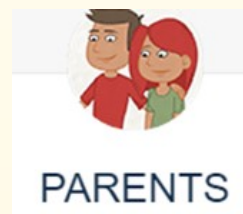
Please note that permission forms & money need to be returned to the school prior to the day of the excursion or your child risks not being able to attend.

uEducateUs for Parents!

Attached to this newsletter are parent letters about how you are now able to access our school management system, uEducateUs. This will enable families to:



- ◆ Track attendance
- ◆ Receive End of semester reports
- ◆ Receive newsletters
- ◆ Respond to permission forms
- ◆ Communicate with teachers and the school

Not all of these functions will be available yet, but will be progressively rolled out over the coming weeks and months.

The letter contains your confidential login details which give access to your child's individual information, so should be kept safe and not shared with others, including your children. They will receive their own login details when they are given access to the platform. You will need to install the uEducateUs app either on your phone, laptop or computer. If you select to install on your phone, you can follow these basic directions:

Installing the uEducateUs Application

In order to download and install the uEducateUs Mobile Application you must navigate to the default storefront for your device.

If you are an **Android** user this will be the **Google Play** store:



if you are an **iPhone** or **iPad** user this would be the **App Store**:



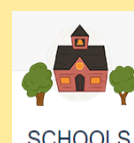
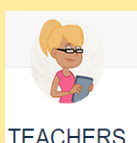
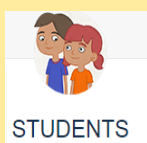
Once the app has finished downloading and has been installed on your device, click on the **uEducateUs** icon to open it:



Note: On iOS devices you may be asked whether you would like to allow Push Notifications the first time you open the app. We strongly recommend you select Allow in order to receive all relevant information from your school, however notification settings can be changed at any time.

Please also note: The above instructions for iOS and Android Push Notification settings may be different to the settings you have on your phone. Due to differences in Operating system versions and differences in proprietary settings between the various brands, the screen and page layouts may vary. If you have any queries in regards to navigating your device please consult your User Manual or contact your device manufacturer.

To install on a laptop or computer, go to: <http://ueducateus.com.au/> and use the login details in your letter.
