Camp 2019 +

After several meetings, and a final meeting this week, the schools involved in our regular combined camps, came to the decision that in order for camps to continue, we needed to change the structure. Most, if not all DET approved school camps, have minimum number requirements and even combining our four schools, this was becoming almost impossible. As of 2019, students in grades 4, 5, & 6 will go on an annual camp. At this stage, it will likely be on a three year cycle between an urban camp, bush/beach camp and Billabong Ranch. This will still be dependent upon availability and costings with many camps requiring two years prior notice for booking.

CFA Visit

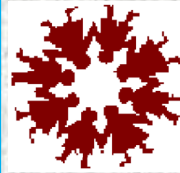

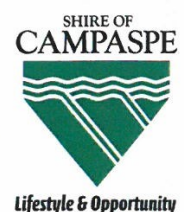

CONFLICT

VS

BULLYING



Not all negative, socially unacceptable behavior is "bullying"

CONFLICT is a natural part of life. **PEOPLE** view things **DIFFERENTLY** and have **DISAGREEMENTS** at times. It is important not to label **CONFLICT** or **FIGHTING** as **BULLYING**.

Schools use these guidelines to help determine if the situation is conflict or Harassment, Intimidation, or Bullying (HIB). The school will take action in both cases.

CONFLICT	BULLYING
1 Between Friends/Equals/Peers	Not Friends/Imbalance of Power
2 Spontaneous/Occasional	Repeated Over Time
3 Accidental/Not Planned	Intentional
4 Little or No Serious/Lasting Harm	Physical/Emotional Harm
5 Equal Emotional Reaction to the Incident	Unequal Emotional Reaction to the Incident
6 Not Done for Domination/Control	Seeking Control/Possession/Domination
7 Sense of Remorse	No Remorse, Blames the Target
8 Desire to Solve the Problem	No Effort to Solve the Problem
