Activities of the day also featured slime and bubble making, and building a bridge out of newspapers!

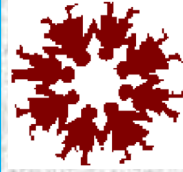

One hundred years ago on 11 November 1918, four bloody years of brutal conflict came to an end. Almost 62,000 Australians died fighting for our freedom and in the service of our nation. Each year on this day, Australians observe one minute's silence at 11am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts.

To commemorate the centenary of the Armistice that ended the First World War, the Stanhope RSL Sub Branch will be holding a Remembrance Service on Sunday 11 November 2018 at the Stanhope War Memorial starting at 10.50 am. Everyone is invited to attend and place a wreath or flowers in remembrance of relatives who had served in the Armed services and are now no longer with us.
