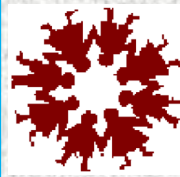

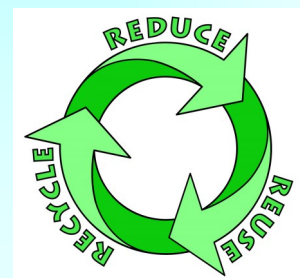

On the 11th of September the 3-6 class got some new equipment. We call them pods. The equipment is to help the class hear the teacher, without the teacher having to yell. It works by each table having one of the pods. Each pod is numbered from 1-4.

The teacher has a speaker that they will talk into. Any table can call the teacher. If somebody calls the teacher, the teacher gets a buzz in their ear and then they press a button on the remote for the pods (the numbered pod that called) and then the pod that called can talk to the teacher without having to get up! 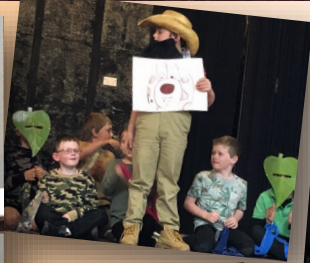
