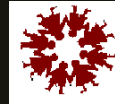

Important information

- Each entrant team must comprise a child aged between 5 and 10 years, or 11 and 15 years, and an adult.
- Entries must be delivered to the Echuca Library, 310 Hare Street, Echuca by 11am on the date of the event Monday, 23 September. Late delivery may result in the entry being excluded from judging.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a label or card with the name of the recipe and a list of key ingredients. Labels *must not* identify the name of the entrants.
- Each entrant will then receive an allocated numbered ticket to ensure anonymity for judging purposes
- Judging will commence at 1pm on **Monday, 23 September**. Entrants and family members are invited to attend the judging session, which will be an entertaining and informative part of the afternoon.
- Agricultural show judging rules will generally apply (see tip sheet for guidance).
- Watch the judging then sample the entries at afternoon tea.

The Great Heritage Family Bake-Off

Tips for Entrants

(Provided by Liz Harfull, author, The Australian Blue Ribbon Cookbook and Tried, Tested and True)

- The main criteria judges generally use to assess entries include colour, aroma, flavour and overall appearance and presentation. Judges will cut or break every cookery entry to check the texture, even distribution of ingredients and whether it is cooked through properly.
- Leaving the paper lining on the bottom of your cake, or having any sign of cooling rack marks are regarded as major faults in show cooking. One of the first things a judge will do is tip your cake upside down to check the bottom. To avoid marks, use a cooling rack or wooden chopping board, covered with several layers of clean, wrinkle-free tea towels.
- Avoid using a thick skewer to test whether your cake is cooked – it will leave a noticeable channel. Try a small thin skewer or knitting needle, and use it sparingly.
- For this competition, entrants may use any sized cake pan, of any shape.
- The cake class is not about having the best decorated cake. The quality of the baking and the taste are very important. If the cake is iced, use a moderate amount and apply it neatly.
- Slices should be cut into even-sized pieces. Avoid using the outside edges.
- Plain or single-layered biscuits, such as Anzacs, must be crisp. When broken, they should snap cleanly.
- Given that the items will be served for afternoon tea, unlike show competitions, there is no limit to the number of pieces that you can put on the plate, however the judges will be looking for consistency on each plate.
- Baked entries need to be even in colour, including the bottom and sides.
