Swimming Program Concludes

Overcoming fear of the water through gentle support and encouragement has meant several students will now be safer around water. Next Tuesday, staff, students and I will meet with our Reviewer, Wendy Larcombe and our Senior Education Improvement Leader, Paul Hon, for the first day of our Review process. The day will be spent gathering input from students and staff about the teaching and learning program, analysing data trends and preparing the school's direction for the next four years.

School Uniform

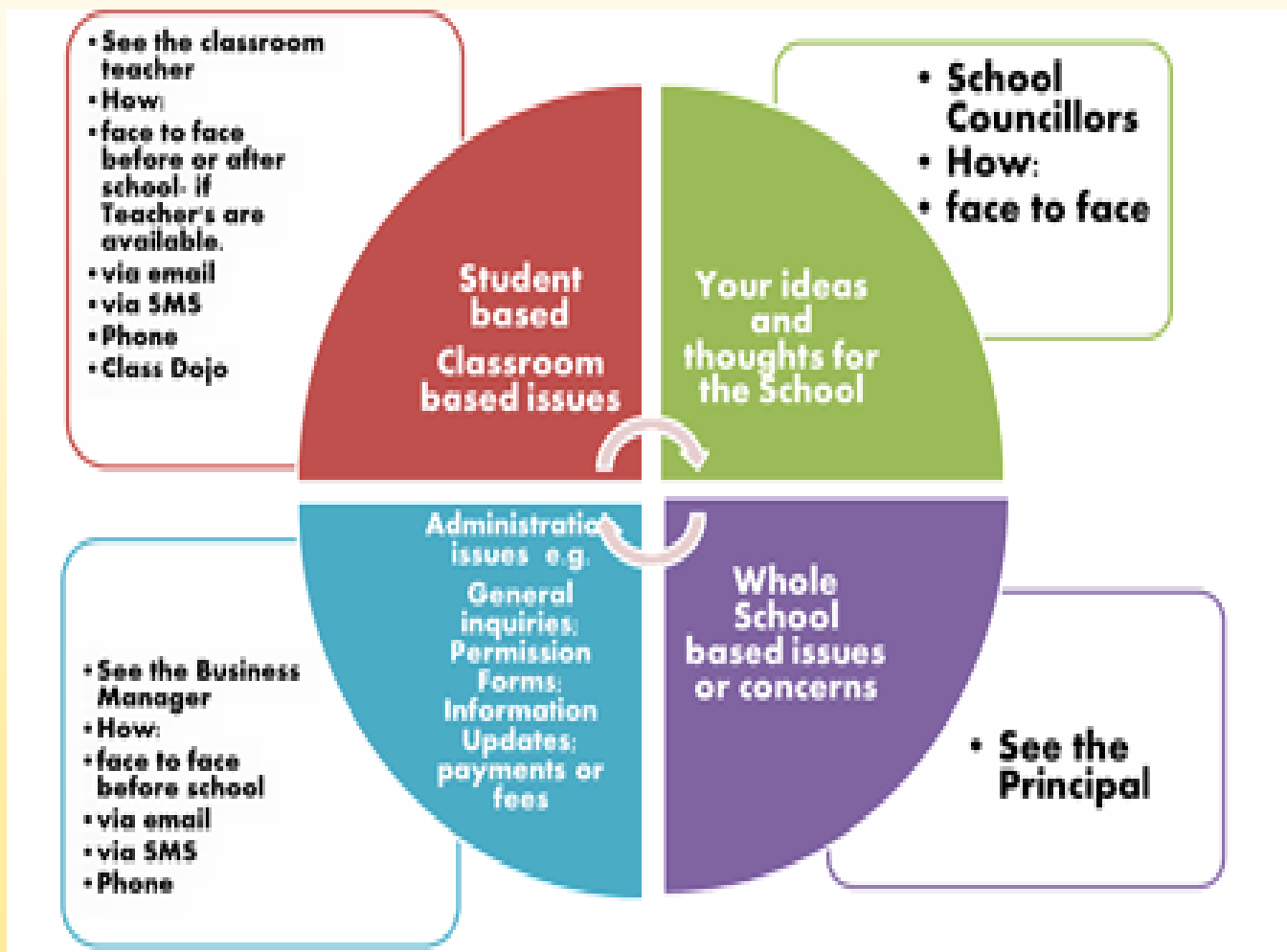

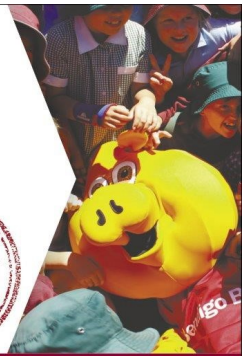
