## **BYOD for 2020**

As has been the case since we began BYOD, the invitation is just that, an invitation. At this stage families are not required to provide a BYOD. We have selected grade 4 & 5 primarily, since they will gain the longest benefit from their devices, before moving onto secondary school where the type of specified device may well be different to that suggested here. The information being sent out, **next week**, provides information for any parent wishing to purchase their child their own device. This is so student owned devices are compatible with the school's and the Department's systems.
