

Why did the white people take over?


How did aboriginal people survive so long?

Calling on all rural and regional areas -

Any symptoms - get tested. It's not over yet.



Now, more than ever we need all Victorians - no matter where they are - to be vigilant; adhere to physical distance guidelines, maintain hygiene practices and crucially they must get tested if they have any symptoms, and stay at home.
