Parent Opinion Survey

Stanhope Primary School invites all families to participate in the 2022 Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey. The resulting data is collated and de-identified.

Vandalism

It was extremely disappointing to see that we had been visited by thoughtless vandals sometime over the weekend or on Friday evening. Rubbish had been removed form our rubbish compound and thrown around the grounds, sports equipment also had been thrown around. A large amount of rubbish was also thrown around in the playground and grounds. Most heartbreaking was the wilful destruction of our plover's nest. Staff and students had been monitoring the progress and observing the plovers while they nested on our oval. We had left a large area when mowing, so as they could nest and allow the chicks to hatch. 

Five tips for parents

2. Build a sharing culture

Even with young children - show them photos on your phone, or your favourite websites. Influence them by sharing videos you find that they might not see and then foster that as they become older and encourage sharing things they find on social media (not by following them) by sending a message or just showing it on their phone screen.

Normalise that there are things they want to show and share, some things they won't - and so that should be - parents shouldn't know everything their child does or says with friends.

You want to build a relationship of sharing, so when something does go wrong for them, and they need help - they come to you.

Positive Start is providing free holiday camps to eligible Victorian students in years 3 - 12.

Camp providers are fully accredited and provide a safe, inclusive and supportive environment.

When choosing a holiday camp, consider how long your child will be comfortable away from home. It might be worthwhile visiting the camp with your child before booking so they can feel comfortable when arriving.

Also consider the camp's location. If this is your child's first time on holiday camp, it is best to stay reasonably local.

To book a place in a holiday camp:

- 1. Eligible students must have completed an <u>expression of interest form through their school</u> and received a unique booking code
- 2. Look through the available camps in the directory below under 'Excursions & Incursions' (make sure you click on the 'View more events' to see the full list)
- 3. Choose your preferred camp
- 4. Book directly with the camp via the link in the camp listing, using the unique booking code.

If you need help with your booking or have further questions the camp provider can't answer, contact the Positive Start team at positivestart@education.vic.gov.au OR contact Christine or Mica at school.

Eligibility

Students in years 3 to 12, who meet one or more of the following criteria are eligible to attend a free holiday camp:

- attend a school that experienced closures of five days or more due to a positive COVID-19 case or close contact in 2021
- have an approved Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) application for 2022
- have a parent that holds a valid means-tested concession card (for example a Health Care Card, Job Seeker, Newstart Allowance, Disability Support Pension)
- are in out of home care
- have a disability
- are from a refugee background
- are Koorie students
- are in the Navigator program
- · are young carers.
