### From the Principal

### **Learning for ALL**

Last Thursday I attended the Area forum for principals in our network and those of other networks in our Region. One of the main topics was the difficulty in attracting teachers to school vacancies. Many, if not most schools are currently short staffed despite offering a wide range of incentives.

Fortunately, at Stanhope Primary School, we have the full complement of staff our budget can maintain for this year.

Other topics included celebrating our hard-working teachers for the incredible job they do every day and the huge impact they have on children's lives. We also discussed the benefits of collaboration and cooperation between schools and making the most of what each individual school has to offer and then sharing that with other schools.

### **Student Learning**

We've had a busy week with lots of great learning going on! In English, we've been focussing on Recounts and Sequencing.

Through various circumstances we had only three students at school on Wednesday and this meant it was possible to individually assess students in aspects of English and Maths competencies and skills. Students benefit greatly from families supporting their children and being involved with their learning every day. This might look like playing number plate games in the car, reading signs and labels in the supermarket, I Spy games, chanting nursery rhymes and finger plays, so that children can hear how language works and words can rhyme. There are dozens of games and ways to engage in everyday literacy and numeracy learning with your children. One of the most important things is to listen to them read each day, either after school or before they come to school.


We've been reading Mem Fox's 'Wilfred Gordon McDonald Partridge'. We've learnt about memories and how important they are.

## Pancake Day




Great Work, Blake. Sequencing How to make Pancakes.

Measuring (maths), how ingredients react (science), reading recipes (literacy), and about other cultures (social sciences)!!!























# Stanhope Primary School ENROLMENTS

### What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006.

A school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

### Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent member category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.

A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

A small number of school councils have **nominee members**.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

### Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

### Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

### How can you become involved?

By participating in the school council elections by completing a selfnomination form and returning it by **NEXT THURSDAY 2<sup>nd</sup> March** to the posting box in the school office.

Further, the name, membership category, gender (optional), term of office, office held (if any) of school council members and notification whether the member is an employee of the Department will be forwarded to the Department of Education and Training by the principal by 30 April each year as a record of council membership and may be used for statistical purposes.
