I trust our students and their families have had an enjoyable break from the routines and obligations of school for the past two weeks and are ready for our next learning challenges and opportunities. Term 3 has begun with our students looking at the NAIDOC celebrations, its history and its impact. They have learned about some of the iconic images and stories and what they represent and have learned about some of the significant Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. We will soon begin looking at our theme of 'Fairytale' and exploring their origins and what they were designed to teach us.
